The temple was established by Tokuitsu Daishi about 1,200 years ago, and the principal image of the temple, Fukuman Kokuzo Bosatsu (Bodhisattva), is said to have been created by Kobo Daishi. 



Yanohara Wetland is the second oldest marsh in Japan. In spring, flowers of skunk cabbage and buckbean bloom, and in early summer, you can see water lilies and cotton grass floating on the water's surface.
